ELIGIBILITY & BENEFITS

Eligibility:

- Pediatricians, occupational therapists and mental health providers who work with children
- Available for 30-minute semi-structured interview

Benefits:

OUR PURPOSE

The purpose of this study is to collect information from the treatment team members involved in the care of children with fetal alcohol syndrome disorders. This is to provide updated information from providers to understand the needs of the children with FASD, and the treatment process for FASD.



THE VISION

Other large cities like San Diego and Los Angeles have an established FASD clinic that offers evidence-based treatments. Although the Inland Empire has a high rate of children affected by fetal alcohol exposure, there is not an established clinic to offer evidence-based treatments after children leave the SART clinic at age 5 years.

This study aims to assess the need for evidence based treatments for children with FASD in the local Inland Empire community.
